

<b>SOAPS Citations:</b>	
Who is the <b>Speaker</b> ?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Identification of the historical person (or group of people) who created the primary source</b></li> <li>• Include what you know about this person's role in history or current events.</li> </ul>
What is the <b>Occasion</b> ?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>The time and place; the situation</b></li> <li>• It is particularly important to understand the context that encouraged the primary source to be created.</li> </ul>
Who is the <b>Audience</b> ?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>The readers to whom this document is directed</b></li> <li>• The audience may be one person or a group; it may be a certain person or a certain people.</li> </ul>
What is the <b>Purpose</b> ?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>The reason behind the text;</b></li> <li>• Why was it written? What goal did the author have in mind?</li> </ul>
What is the <b>Subject</b> ?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>What is the document about?</b></li> <li>• What event of historic importance does the document reveal details about?</li> </ul>
